Our Foundress:

Life History: Mother Teresa was born on January 29th, 1858 in Chennai, to devout Catholic parents. Christened Mary Grace, she lost her mother at a young age, but her caring and affectionate father provided her with an excellent education that prepared her for her future mission. When she was 28 years old, she was invited to teach in a school in Alleppey (Kerala) managed by the Carmelite priests. The school was not

functioning satisfactorily when she took over the reins, but she quickly turned it into a success story. A little later, Mary Grace who took her oath to be a Carmelite Sister, was professed in 1884 and subsequently named *Sr. Teresa of St. Rose of Lima*.

Sr. Teresa eventually began teaching in St. Joseph's Convent at Alleppey and lived a fearful religious life. In 1887, she was entrusted with the responsibility of educating and caring for the needy and the oppressed in Ernakulam. It was for this noble mission that she founded the Congregation of Carmelite Sisters of St. Teresa on April 24th, 1887 in Ernakulam. As the foundress of the Congregation of Carmelite Sisters, she responded in a prophetic manner to the demands of the Gospel and the Church and led the marginalized in society to live with dignity and secure their rightful place in society by fostering a 'civilization of love'. Soon she became a 'Mother' to the poor the orphan and outcast of the society.

Sr.Teresa and her congregation became the pride of the neighborhood with its selfless service to the sick and the dying, caring for the destitute, and a soup kitchen for the famine-hit public. In just fifteen years, Mother Teresa placed the congregation among the most note- worthy in social service, braving all the implicit challenges.

Mother Teresa's remarkable life came to a tragic end on September 12th, 1902, when the train she was travelling in, fell into a river in Andhra Pradesh, following a sudden and violent storm. The congregation, left orphaned by her sudden demise, gathered its strength and continued its life of prayer and apostolic work along

with public service, gradually growing into a widely spread chain of institutions.

Values and Treasures of Mother Foundress

Mother Teresa's death was a fruitful one, a death that was the beginning of a new life. A small seed that was sown in Ernakulam, Kerala has grown today into a large tree. Our CSST institute (Carmelite Sisters of St. Teresa) has accomplished what she had set forth to start. Today its presence is felt in India and outside.

Today, the congregation works in more than 120 institutions worldwide in schools & colleges, technical institutes, social work and social action centers, hospitals & hospices, homes for the aged, sick and destitute, orphanages and prisons, centers for the development & rehabilitation of women & children.

Mount Carmel College (MCC)

Mount Carmel College was established and managed by the congregation of the Carmelite Sisters of St.Teresa, was founded in 1944 in Thrissur and 1948 in Bengaluru to meet the escalating demand for women's education in India. MCC is a Christian Catholic minority institution run primarily for Catholic Students but in the spirit of service, it opens doors to those of all castes and creeds. It Draws its inspiration from the person and teachings of Jesus Christ, Universal master and Model of education.

Today, the student strength is about 12,000 presently studying in the college, which is a remarkable testimony of the vision and mission.

The Mount Carmel Institutions catered to the educational needs of teenage women for over 72 years. Assessments and Promotions

The school will conduct assessments as scheduled in this calendar and attendance is compulsory for all of them.

Pre-Primary

The students' skills are assessed through observation and class work on timely basis as mentioned in this calendar for all the 3 terms.

Primary School: Classes I to V

The student's skills are assessed through observation and class work.

The school has adopted the system of Periodic Assessments, term exam is followed and feedback is provided regularly to parents.

Higher Primary: VI - VII

The student's skills are assessed through observation and class work, the school has adopted the system of periodic assessments & term exams are followed and feedback is provided regularly to parents.

High School VIII - X

The school has adopted the system of Periodic Assessments a Half Yearly Exam and a Yearly Exam is followed and feedback is provided regularly to parents.

RULES/CRITERIA FOR PROMOTION TO HIGHER CLASS:

Internal Assessment: The Continual Internal Assessment will be based on the performance of a child through Classroom observation, field trips, scrapbook, nature study, monthly projects, skills oriented work, assignments etc...

- 1. No child will be detained if she
- a. has at least 85% attendance
- b. shows satisfactory progress in language and number work.
- 2. If the child's progress is not satisfactory, the parent will have to give an undertaking that the child will make satisfactory progress in the next assessment.
- In case the child is unable to cope up with the syllabus in the whole
 academic year, then parents need to make an effort to help her
 improve or abide by the management's decision for the benefit of
 the child.

Evaluation of Scholastic Areas:

- 1. Each term will have Periodic Assessment followed by a Term Exam.
- Misconduct and malpractice in an examination disqualifies the student for the whole exam.
- 3. Promotion to higher class will be determined on the basis of the performance throughout the year with due weightage in assessments, projects and notes (class & homework)
- 4. Results once declared at the end of the year are final and will not be reconsidered in any case.
- A pupil who is unable to score average passing marks in any tests or who is overage for the class by 2 years will have to take Transfer Certificate.
- 6. Students will not be allowed to write the Yearly Examination unless their fees have been paid in full before the examinations.
- 7. Parents have to sign the Assessment report issued at the end of each term.

Evaluation Areas:

- The assessment structure and examination have been prepared in view of the capability of a child.
- The subject enrichment activities (SEA) like projects, PPT will be conducted for all the subjects over the course of the year and carry a weightage of 5%. Students have to adhere to the format as instructed and follow the time schedule for submission of the same.

Notebooks:

Maintenance and completion of class work and homework will carry a weightage of 5%.

Co-Scholastic Areas:

Life-skills, attitudes and values, participation, achievement in activities involving literary and creative skills, scientific skills, aesthetic skills, performance in Theatre arts, clubs and health and physical education will also be evaluated.

Subject Enrichment Activities :

These are subject-specific activities aimed at enhancing the understanding and skills of the students. This will be evaluated throughout the term and evaluated at the end of the term.

Languages:

Students listening and speaking skills will be assessed by the teacher in the parameter set for the class.

Science:

Practical lab work and activities will be taken as suggested in the Syllabus and Text books.

Social Science:

Map or project work will be undertaken as suggested in the Syllabus and Text books.

Mathematics:

Mental math activities along with basic math suggested in the Syllabus and Text books.

School Formal Uniform

To ensure uniformity among our students wearing of uniform is compulsory. The color and design is decided by the school authority. The parents are requested to order their child's uniform only from the authorized tailors and suppliers. Any worn out uniforms must be replaced with a new one and students are to be neatly dressed.

Code of conduct:

The following conduct expectations and the expectations of parents and teachers alike, serve to provide safety, well-Being and harmony within the community.

1. School Attendance and Regularity Policy:

- All students are required to attend school regularly. They must have a minimum attendance of 85% overall for the academic year.
- Students are expected to be in school by 8:20 a.m. every morning. Students who come to school after 8:30 a.m. are liable to face disciplinary action.
- Leave of absence from school for weddings, functions etc. must be applied in advance of the planned leave and sanction must be taken from the Principal/ Coordinator, failing which disciplinary action will be taken as the management deems fit.

^{*}School office will be closed on Saturday afternoons, Sundays, second Saturdays and on Public holidays.

- Prior permission for leave of absence from school must be applied in writing by the parents and for valid reason only. General terms of excuse "For some business" "For some ceremony" etc will not be entertained.
- Attendance on the opening day, school functions, special events and closing day of every term/long vacations is compulsory.
- Absence will only be excused in the case of an illness. These
 absences will have to be supported by a note from a doctor. If
 the absence exceeds three successive days, prior notice must
 be forwarded to the principal and permission obtained
 followed by submission of medical certificate to the office.
- Continued absence for a week without leave, shall be considered equivalent to withdrawal of a pupil from the school and his name shall be struck off the register.
- Special notice will be taken of absence without leave from class tests.
- Those who are absent themselves on the re-opening day after the holidays, without prior permission from the Principal / Vice Principal / coordinator, may have to pay a fine. In case of illness, a medical certificate shall be required.
- A pupil, absent without leave during any one class hour of either session of the day, shall be regarded as absent for the entire session.
- A pupil marked absent, without permission shall continue to be marked absent, until she produces an order from the Principal to be marked present
- A pupil who has been suffering from an infectious disease must produce a medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner, so that he/she may attend school without the risk of spreading infection. The principal reserves the right, however of extending the time of readmitting the pupil to classes after obtaining medical advice.
- The person authorised to pick the student must get the Escort Card which must be carried with him/her while on the school premises to pick the child.
- A leave note has to be provided to the class teacher if the holidays exceed 2 days. Parents have to maintain the discipline and write the Leave note on an A4 size sheet in the prescribed format only that is mentioned in this hand book.

2. Disciple for the student:

- The school day begins with an assembly at 8:30 am (Primary and High school respectively). The students must be in school 10mins before the assembly. Habitual late comers will not be allowed to attend classes until permitted by the Principal /Vice Principal/coordinator.
- The first bell is given every day 8:20 am and the second bell 5
 minutes later 8:25 am. All students must be inside the
 classroom or be in line for the assembly on the ground before
 the second bell. At the third bell, all must stand still, in their
 places silently.
- Pupils are expected to rise and wish the teacher, while she enters the classroom and remain standing in silence till they are asked to sit or till the teacher takes her seat
- During the school day, if a student needs to leave the school campus, she must obtain permission from the Principal or the Vice Principal and the Class Teacher. No student will be allowed to leave school premises unless accompanied by parent/guardian.
- Every pupil must wish the members of the staff(all teachers) on the occasion, of her first meeting them for the day, within the school premises or outside.
- Students are not allowed to receive visitors during the school hours. They are not allowed to receive or make calls unless the school deems it necessary.
- Mobile phones, smart watches, ear phones or any gadgets are strictly prohibited in the school for students. If any student is found carrying them it will be confiscated and will not be returned till the end of the academic year.
- Buying items from outside campus or sending the school security guard to make a purchase is not permitted.
- Any sort of playing cards, sports collection cards etc., are not permitted and will be confiscated.
- Students will not deface any of the classroom furniture or school property. Breakage, carving, graffiti, misuse of any of the school property will be deemed as an offence.
- In order to preserve simplicity and uniformity among our students, wearing of any sort of make-up kajal, mehendi, jewelry, chains or accessories, bands, fancy watches, nail polishes, etc is not allowed.
- Every child has to maintain a Journal & read at least 2 times books in a month from the school library.

- Wearing of Gold jewelry is strictly prohibited (If any loss the school will not be held responsible)
- Dyeing hair in any colour other than natural colour is not permitted.
- All hair accessories must be maroon.
- Earrings are permitted preferably studs. (Long dangling earrings are not allowed)
- Applying of Mehendi is strictly not allowed during schools days. Students who do so will be dealt with necessary action.
- Students who would want to visit the canteen due to unavoidable situations should get a written permission from the parent in the diary. At no point can she buy junk food for lunch.
- Students are expected to move in a single line with hands at the back while going to the library, computer lab, science laboratory, language room and school field without causing disturbance to other classes.
- Any loss of books etc. suffered by the student must be reported immediately to the Class teacher /teacher-incharge. The school will not take responsibility to search for the book. The student is solely responsible for her belongings.
- Library books that are lost or damaged need to be replaced. In case the student is unable to procure the same, the cost of the book should be paid for in the school office.
- Irregular attendance, insubordination to teachers, habitual inattention to school work and obscenity in word or action are sufficient reasons for disciplinary action.
- School prayer, before and after a meal should be learnt by all.
- Tattoos are prohibited. (Temporary and permanent)
- Students may not cut cakes and offer presents to their teachers to celebrate their birthdays or any such occasions.
- Students are prohibited from bringing slam books, novels, picture magazines, toys, comics, cosmetics, lip balms, change of clothes or shoes.
- Pupils are solely responsible for their personal belongings, items brought to the school should have their name and class on it. Any property found on the premises will be handed over to the reception counter. The school will not undertake any responsibility in case of damage or loss.

- Usage of any other language other than English in school is not allowed. Profanity and use of obscene and rude language/ gestures and slang lang (Bro/Cool. Etc) will not be tolerated.
- Students must be courteous to all school workers and staff.
- Students' hygiene in terms of cleanliness in terms of physical appearance needs to be attended on a daily basis.
- Uniform must be cleaned and ironed every day.
- Hair for girls need to be neatly combed in two plaits with ribbon and tied up off the face in case of hair that is shoulder length or longer no fringe cuts are allowed.
- Hair falling over the face must be neatly pinned. No excuses such as 'hair is too short' 'haircut is different'
- Nails must be trimmed well and will be checked twice a week.
- Chewing bubble gum is not permitted in the school premises.
- Eating Chocolates, Junk, Lunch during class hours is not allowed.
- Junk food like chips, pizza, burger, noodles are not allowed for lunch or snacks.
- Any form of bullying other students in school or outside will be dealt with strict measures.
- Books must be brought according to the daily time table.
- This Handbook/Calendar should be brought to school every day.

Misconduct

A student of MCCS will represents, the school even outside school hours and wherever she goes. Misconduct of a serious nature that has a direct relationship to the school may result in disciplinary action, even when the specific conduct does not take place on school property or at a school – related event. Students should also bear in mind that getting caught in any demeaning act in their school uniform with ID card outside the school premises may also be considered as an offence towards the school and necessary action will follow.

To Parents and Guardians

- Parents and guardians are requested to co-operate with the school authorities by enforcing discipline and regularity at home.
- Parents are to look into the School Handbook/Calendar every evening and see to it that the Home assignment for the next day

- is done punctually.
- Remarks made in the diary should be seen and signed by the parent without fail.
- Parents and guardians should make it a point to meet the teachers without fail during the **Parent's Orientation** and also the **Parent - Teachers' Conference** that will be organized by the school. Prior permission (written) has to be taken from the Principal/Vice Principal/Coordinator if unable to attend.
- Parents and guardians or other persons are not allowed to visit the student or their teachers during school hours.

Parents & guardians (Primary) can meet the teachers on Saturdays (1st & 3rd) High school on fourth Saturdays between 9:00 to 12:00.

- Any form of criticism of a teacher or of the school in front of students should be strictly avoided. If you have a genuine complaint or problem, please contact the Principal or the Coordinator.
- Circulating objectionable messages about the school, teacher or management should strictly avoid. If you have a genuine complaint or problem regarding your own child, please contact the Principal or the Vice Principal or the Coordinator at the stipulated office time with prior appointment individually. No group of parents will be entertained pertaining to any matter.
- Members of whatsapp groups indulging in gossip and slander against the school/teachers will not be entertained and no meetings will take place with such parents in the school. All issue grievances will be addressed but please confine your queries/grievances to your own child.
- Parent's Vehicles are not allowed inside the school gate at all times.
- Parents who come to pick up kindergarten students can enter the school gate only 15 mins early to the session and not prior to that.
- Parents cannot sit in the school campus to feed, pick up another child or any such reasons.
- Parents who have any discussion pertaining their child need to first meet the Class teacher/Subject teacher then the Coordinator or the Vice Principal. If the matter still needs the Principals' attention, only then will a meeting be arranged through the concerned Coordinator.

- The management will not be responsible for your child once she is picked up by the ward from the assigned area in the school campus.
- The **Escort Card** for picking up the children has to be brought by the parents/Pick up assistants and presented at the gate every day. Failing which the parents need to meet the Coordinator before picking up the child.
- All written correspondence (Letter or email) with the school should be addressed to the Principal, MOUNT CARMEL CENTRAL SCHOOL. It should include full name of the child, along with the class and section.

Parents play an important role in the education of their children, and can support the efforts of school staff in maintaining a safe, inclusive, accepting, and respectful learning environment for all students. Parents fulfil their role when they:

- Are engaged in their child's school work and progress;
- Communicate regularly with the school;
- Help their child be appropriately dressed and prepared for school;
- Ensure that their child attends school regularly and on time
- Promptly report to the school their child's absence or late arrival:
- Show that they are familiar with the school rules;
- Encourage and assist their child in following the rules of behaviour;
- Assist school staff in dealing with disciplinary issues involving their child.

Parents are requested not to cover their faces while inside the school campus with helmet, scarf, mask etc. The school needs to identify you while picking up or dropping off your child. This is for the safety of the students. Kindly cooperate.

Infractions & Disciplinary Actions:

In addressing infractions the following mitigating factors will be kept in mind such as age, circumstances, history and a progressive disciplinary approach which could include the following:

- contact with the pupil's parent(s)/guardian(s);
- verbal or written reminders
- review of expectations

- written work assignment with a learning component relevant to the behavior;
- detention
- restorative justice
- Transfer.

In some circumstances suspensions and expulsions may result.

Admission Procedure and Requirements

- A Candidate shall not be admitted without an application in the prescribed format accompanied by a TC (Transfer Certificate) that has to be attested by the education officer of that place (if from another state)
- 2. Every student coming in from any other syllabus schools (State / ICSE /IGCSE) should get an eligibility certificate and their Transfer Certificate Countersigned by the BEO.
- Parents and guardians are requested to ensure the name and date of birth of the child before they are recorded in the school register. Once they are entered in the school register it cannot be altered or changed without the written permission of the Director of Public Instruction of Karnataka.
- 4. Records of past progress and good conduct shall be required from pupils before they are admitted.

Withdrawal from a Class

- 1. Application for Transfer Certificate or Conduct Certificate shall be submitted in writing.
- 2. Transfer Certificate or Conduct Certificate will be issued only during working days, if it is required.
- 3. After a lapse of more than one year from the date on which the pupil left the school, a service fee will be charged.
- 4. On no account can a T C be issued to a pupil whose fees have not been paid in full, failing which they will be put under SOS (Student Out of School) list.

Fee Regulations

- 1. Fees should be paid on time for the Academic year.
- 3. After each admission will be issued a fee receipt/challan.
- 4. FEES ONCE PAID WILL NOT BE REFUNDED either in part or full.

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
